

FUTURES Foundation's 2018-19 Mini-Grant Program on www.FindItFundItFlorida.com/Volusia

FUTURES Foundation for Volusia County Schools will continue utilizing the Find It Fund It online system for our 2018-19 Mini-Grant Program. Beginning June 4, 2018 we'll be accepting applications for the funding of projects which demonstrate innovative and effective ways to meet students' needs through curriculum standards and increase motivation to learn on www.FindltFundltFlorida.com/Volusia. Use Chrome browser which works best! Grants of up to \$1,000 each may be submitted for projects and applications are limited to no more than two (2) per teacher. However, there is no limit of applications per school.

The FUTURES Mini-Grant Program's objective is to encourage and support teachers and administrative staff who have great ideas for creative use of curriculum that will provide enhanced learning experiences for students. In 2018-19, Teachers must include the curriculum standards the grant activity(ies) will relate to and outline the specific grant activity(ies). If books are being requested, please list each book title, ensure the book is grade level appropriate and verify your media specialist has approved each title. Mini-Grants enable the purchase of special materials and resources for the classroom and are intended to support projects that are not provided for within school budgets or through other means.

Who May Apply?

All Volusia County Public Schools' K-12 teachers and administrative staff are encouraged to apply. It is the policy of FUTURES Foundation that Charter Schools shall not be eligible to apply for grants under the FUTURES Mini-Grant Program, absent extenuating circumstances to be considered by the Board of Directors at its sole discretion from time to time.

DEADLINE for submission: 6 p.m. Friday, September 7, 2018

Mini-Grant recipients agree to:

- Attend a mandatory Mini-Grant Awards Celebration for recipients, donors, community members & FUTURES Board Members from 5 to 7 p.m. in October (exact date TBD) at Mainland High School.
- Purchase all items and complete his/her project on or before Friday, April 1, 2019

 Complete an online Impact Report including an upload of photos of your project on or before 6 p.m. Monday, April 22, 2019 on <u>www.FindltFlorida.com/Volusia</u> (use Chrome browser).

MINI-GRANT Criteria

A committee consisting of educators, community leaders and FUTURES Board Members and staff shall review the online applications. The committee will place an emphasis on grant projects in the following subject areas: literacy, energy (solar and alternative) education and awareness, STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics), and the arts. Grant applications should address student achievement and be related to the school improvement plan/priority items. In 2018-19, Teachers must include the curriculum standards the grant activity(ies) will relate to and outline the specific grant activity(ies). If books are being requested, please list each book title, ensure the book is grade level appropriate and verify your media specialist has approved each title before you submit your grant!

For 2018-19, we <u>hope</u> to have \$3,000 in special funding for projects relating to heart health courtesy of Heart of Volusia, Inc. If you are interested in this funding, please ensure your grant request specifically states its relationship to heart health and healthy living and select the <u>Heart Health</u> <u>Subject.</u>

For 2018-19, we will have \$10,000 in special funding for projects relating to solar and alternative energy courtesy of Duke Energy Foundation. If you are interested in this funding, please ensure your grant request specifically states its relationship to solar and alternative energy and use <u>the Solar & Alternative Energy Subject.</u>

The committee reserves the right to make adjustments in your grant request. Grant funding is **not to be used** to fund <u>t-shirts</u>, <u>awards</u>, <u>incentives</u>, <u>food</u>, <u>travel</u>, <u>certificate requests</u>, <u>salaries</u> (including <u>substitutes' salary</u>) and <u>staff development or to supplant existing funding opportunities</u>. Computer hardware such as Nooks, Kindles, IPads, laptops, desktops & regular printers; web based programs; and subscriptions **will not be funded**.

Ancillary hardware such as Ozobots, Lego Mindstorm and other such robotic devices **are not excluded** for Makerspace and STEM initiatives.

All software and apps must be cleared by the district's Technology Services department. <u>General Mini-Grant Guidelines</u>

Find it & Fund it Florida is an interactive online portal for Volusia County Public Schools which allows teachers to post two projects for funding up to <u>\$1,000</u> each.

To post new projects, teachers and staff who did not already register on Find It Fund It in a prior school year, during the grant application process may apply by visiting <u>www.FindltFundltFlorida.com/Volusia</u> and following these simple steps using CHROME browser which works the best:

- 1. For your initial registration, please use the registration button on the top right hand side of the page. Then select whether you are a donor, principal or teacher.
- 2. Use your school system email address as only emails ending in @volusia.k12.fl.us will be accepted and this becomes your user name as well.
- 3. You'll then receive a message stating you've been registered and reminding you your email address is your user name.
- 4. Log-in using your user name and password.
- 5. Use the menu bar at the top left to navigate through your account. You can check your activity, approval status, submitted projects, drafts, etc. anytime simply by logging into your profile.
- 6. If you change schools at any time, you will need to update your profile immediately to reflect your new school (if you do not make this change, your requests will be sent to the incorrect principal for approval).
- 7. To create a new grant request, click on the Add A Grant Request button to start entering your new projects using the on-screen instructions. We HIGHLY recommend that you write your request in a Word Document so you can print and always have a copy for your records. Then, copy and paste your text into the on-line application request form. This also makes it easier if your principal or FUTURES requests you modify your grant in any way.
- 8. Ensure each of the sections -- Goal, What will be done with My Students, Benefits to My Students, Budget Narrative and Budget Items -- include specific details important to the Mini-Grant Committee. These should include the number of students involved in the project, how this proposal will enhance your students, classroom or school (why this would be needed or is important), list the details of your evaluation process, the project must show academic gains and the evaluation should contain quantifiable results with how these results shall be measured. Please also note if this is a continuation of last year's grant and be specific of all budget items (within reason). Please round up to next whole dollar and don't use cents.
- 9. Before submitting your grant to your principal, please ensure the media specialist has approved any books included within the Mini-Grant and please remember they must be age/grade level appropriate for your students.
- 10. If requesting technology software or apps, you should contact Caitlyn Distler for an updated list of supported models. Any technology requests must be vetted through Mike Cicchetti at ext. 20451 or cadistle@volusia.k12.fl.us in Learning Technologies prior to electronic submission. FUTURES will not fund hardware requests through Mini-Grants for Nooks, Kindles, IPads, laptops, desk tops or computer printers. Ancillary hardware such as Ozobots, Lego Mindstorms and other such robotic devices are not excluded for Makerspace and STEM initiatives.
- 11. Once you submit your request, an email is sent to your principal asking her/him to approve it. Once she/he has issued approval it shall be forwarded automatically to FUTURES for review, final approval and consideration for a FUTURES funding allocation. FUTURES anticipates announcing funding allocations by late September with the check presentation/reception in October (exact date TBD) from 5-7 p.m. at Mainland High School. **Please remember that it is ultimately up to you to make sure your principal approves your projects.** If you do not receive principal approval within a week or two, we recommend you speak with or email your principal about your grant(s).

Find It & Fund It will be most successful if we all work together to promote your grant request's needs! Once final approval is received from FUTURES Foundation, teachers and administrators are encouraged to share projects on Facebook and Twitter as well as send emails to friends, family, students' parents/guardians, PTAs, and other business partners in order to spread the word about your grant on www.FindItFundItFlorida.com/Volusia. FUTURES Foundation also will be reaching out to the community and various businesses for support. We ask that you not share your project until it does receive FUTURES approval and is live on the FIFI website, not still in the "review" stage. FUTURES will email you once your grant has been approved and/or approved for funding. Even if you don't receive funding, we encourage you to use FIFI as a means of sharing your project. Please take a look at our "Suggestions for Sharing Find It & Fund It Projects" on the next page for ideas on how to promote your project and this program to assist with additional funding.

A few important items to note:

- ✓ Principals must have all electronic Mini-Grant applications approved or denied by 6 p.m. Friday, September 7, 2018.
- ✓ FUTURES will review all principal approved grants in late September/early October.
- On a date to be determined in October from 5-7 p.m. at Mainland High School, FUTURES will hold a celebration for the distribution of the initial Mini-Grant Funding checks. Recipients are strongly encouraged to attend as special awards are presented and many donors are present for you to meet, thank & engage.
- On the 15th of every month, any non-FUTURES funded donations that have been donated the prior month to a project via the online portal will be dispersed to your school. Donation capabilities on the portal will cease on **Thursday**, **Jan. 31**, **2019**, and **Tuesday**, **February 19**, **2019** will be the last disbursement of donations received through the portal for the 2018-19 school year.
- ✓ If at any time, <u>you determine your project will not come to fruition</u>, please return the funds to FUTURES immediately so they may be re-allocated to a viable project. We realize situations arise so please <u>do not wait until the end of the school year to notify us</u>.
- ✓ Your project must conclude by Monday, April 1, 2019.
- ✓ Funds must be spent during the 2018-19 school year by Monday, April 1, 2019.
- All unused funds over \$25 must be returned to FUTURES by 6 p.m. Monday, April 22, 2019 via a check payable to FUTURES, Inc. (interoffice to us at Facilities Services).
- ✓ Using <u>CHROME browser</u>, you must input your online Impact Report and accompanying photos which outline your grant's impact and success by 6 p.m. Monday, April 22, 2019 into FIFI.
 Please check your <u>spelling & grammar before uploading</u>! Failure to submit the Impact Report by this deadline will disqualify you from Mini-Grant funding the next school year.
- ✓ FUTURES Foundation reserves the right to publicize all grant programs.
- ✓ FUTURES Foundation requires that recipients advertise and note FUTURES Foundation as a source of funding on all grant materials. Our Twitter handle is @FUTURES_Inc and Facebook page is at <u>www.facebook.com/FUTURESfoundation/</u>.
- ✓ Instructional materials funded by a FUTURES grant becomes the property of the school in which the teacher/staff is employed when completing the application process.
- All items purchased with money from Find It & Fund It Florida are the property of the school, not the individual teacher, and must remain with the originating school if the teacher moves to a different school or leaves the District.

All applications must be submitted and approved by your principal/administrator online at <u>www.FindltFundltFlorida.com/Volusia</u> by 6 p.m. on Friday, September 7, 2018.


On each grant page, there are individual links that can be used to share via Facebook, Twitter, and even to send a grant via e-mail.
